Fast Action

Commit to fast once a week and give the cost of
your food to an anti slavery organization

Mentor

Become a mentor for at risk juveniles, change a life
and address the roots that lead people to become
victims and victimizers

Volunteer

Join a local organization that works on advocacy
prevention, rescue, or restoration

Buy - don't buy

Become an informed buyer. Look for fair trade
products like coffee and chocolate. If you can't find
it, ask the manager for it. If they do not carry it, do
not buy it. Find out where and how things are
made: food, candy, clothes, cell phones, tires ...

Write your representative

Support new or better state and local anti-
trafficking laws. Help strengthen state and local
laws by contacting your Governor, Senator or
Representative. As a voter, or soon-to-be voter,
you have the power to demand your
representatives follow an abolitionist agenda. Many
voices asking have power. Consider a letter-writing
campaign.

Hold viewing parties of movies that address this
issue, and offer 10+ ways to get involved

for NGOs that work on slavery issues. Creativity is
